FINAL REPORT

The County of Peterborough sought funding from the Waste Diversion Organization to construct two permanent seasonal Household Special Waste facilities in areas of the County that were not serviced by such facilities.

The facilities each consist largely of a modified intermodal container that is equipped with all the necessary ventilation and spill containment features. The units have also been designed with a self-contained foam injection system. The facilities are equipped with all safety devices necessary including a deluge shower system.

The facilities are approved to allow for a paint exchange and this is another reason for a seasonal operation. Since the buildings are not heated the paint exchange activity only occurs when danger of freezing is not a concern.

The two facilities were opened in September 2001 and are located at the Anstruther Lake Landfill in the Township of North Kawartha and at the 6th Line Landfill site in the Township of Havelock-Belmont-Methuen. The facilities service about 13% (4000) of all County households for a service area of approximately 25 Km. radius around the proposed depots.

The addition of these two depots brings to four the number of seasonal sights operating in the County.

It has therefore been demonstrated that approvable, functional cost-effective facilities can be situated in rural areas of the Province to provide for collection and disposal of Household Waste.
